






Migrations

- Needed majority 55%
- Achieved majority 55.2%
- Slovak as a Head of State Electoral Commission with a "golden vote"

 - 33 opened and 3 provisionally closed chapters





- Parliamentary democracy
- The Prime Minister is head of government
 - current: Duško Marković
- The President is head of state
 - current: Milo Đukanović
 - Directly elected
 - Personal power

 - One party in party since introduction of pluralism
 - Ex Communist party
- Main cleavage:
 - Ethnic statehood


